You will need a high school diploma to enroll in a degree, certificate, and most short-term credential programs at SUNY WCC. We have many options to help you meet that requirement. Classes are available to help you prepare for the high school equivalency test. There is also a 24-credit program designed for students interested in earning their high school equivalency diploma (GED) while earning college credits at the same time.

If, like thousands of older adults, you previously earned college credits through AP courses or credits at another college or at SUNY WCC, the Registrar's Office will assist you in determining which credits can be applied to meet your new educational goals.
